## Major Requirements

**K-8 World Language and Culture Endorsement License:** Students majoring in elementary education have the option of completing an add-on endorsement (<https://catalog.concordiacollege.edu/arts-sciences/education/#endorsementoptionstext>) in one of the five world languages. Each add-on endorsement program prepares students to be recommended for licensure in that world language in grades K-8. Each add-on endorsement requires a separate application for licensure. All students must attain the intermediate-high level of oral proficiency.
